A Message from our President . . .

"In nature, nothing exists alone." - Rachel Carson

Humans exist as a part of the big, interconnected web that is our universe. Just like our ecosystems are connected through groups of complex relationships, so are we to one another. When you Google the meaning of the above quote, attributed to Rachel Carson, who was an influential marine biologist, conservationist and author in the 1950s/60s, it will say, "...one thing can't live by itself because it is interconnected to everything else. It needs support, but it also gives it." I found this description reflective of our human communities. The first words that struck me were "can't" and "need" – having the support of and connection with our fellow humans is not just a nice-to-have. We literally can't survive without others.

We all know needing is different than wanting. When you need something, it can create a power dynamic where one person/group has more power than others. Perhaps that's why our human relationships can be so complicated. We need one another but it's often challenging to get along.

We can again look to nature for guidance, where it is about balance. Symbiosis in nature is defined as a close, prolonged association between two or more species. This relationship can be good, bad or neutral where both parties benefit or only one benefits while one is harmed. (Can't we all think of relationships like these?) But there is another type of symbiosis called *competition*, when several groups compete for limited resources. An example is competition between ocean corals and sponges. Sponges are plentiful in coral reefs but if there are too many, they take food from the corals that make up the reef. Sponges can 'win' by multiplying hugely but if too many corals die, the reef becomes damaged, which in turn kills sponges until the reef is balanced again.

Our relationships also need balance. The interpretation of the quote above notes species not only need support but 'also give.' I believe people want to be contributors/givers just as much as receivers. At WCC we say that everyone needs help sometimes and everyone can give sometimes. Balanced relationships and communities depend upon being able to accept help and giving what you can, when you can.

Mahalo to all of our community members who make up our vast support network, which allows us to provide help when needed. We could not exist without you.
