"I am only one, but still I am one. I cannot do everything, but still I can do something; and because I cannot do everything, I will not refuse to do something that I can do." – Helen Keller

This quote inspires me when challenges seem overwhelming. Sometimes when big things happen, I freeze. I want to retreat into a protective shell and try not to think about the outside world. 

All pre-ordered meals will be available for pick-up at WCC on Wednesdays at 11:30am


