Let Go & Move On

Hau`oli Makahiki Hou! The new year is an opportunity for a fresh start. I heard a story on the radio about a middle school whose credo is "Let Go & Move On," and I thought it was a great credo to think about as we welcome 2024. The school principal said their focus used to be on grit and perseverance but they found that emotional wounds were affecting students' learning. She said middle schools are "mistake factories" and students aren't always able to put those mistakes in perspective. I would add to their credo the idea of learning – that we learn, let go and move on. Although many of us may no longer be students, we should not stop thinking of ourselves as lifelong learners. The more we open ourselves to learning from every experience, good and bad, the richer our lives become. Continual learning is also a pillar of successful aging.

Let Go – Forgiveness

One key idea in letting go is forgiving both yourself and others. The principal said students would often hold onto what went wrong in their day for weeks or even years instead of giving themselves or others a second chance. Now when kids do something wrong or there's a conflict, they learn from it and say 'tomorrow is a new day.' No one is defined by one action. What a great message that we don't have to be defined by our mistakes. As adults when children do something wrong, we usually tell them to take responsibility for their actions, make it right and go forward having learned a lesson. We should take our own advice. Forgive yourself. Let go of past mistakes. Tomorrow is a new day.

Forgiving Others - One of the students gave a great analogy for holding a grudge. They said holding a grudge is like holding onto hot coals and expecting the other person to get burned. It's not very useful! Imagine carrying a backpack filled with all the weight of past grievances, regrets and resentment. How much lighter could you feel without that burden? Letting go of resentment is a powerful act of self-liberation. It doesn't mean forgetting the past, but rather releasing the grip it has on your present and future.

Move On - "A journey of 1,000 miles begins with a single step." (Lao Tzu)

I find this well-known proverb useful when moving on seems overwhelming or scary. It can be easier to hang on to negative past experiences as an excuse to stay where it's safe, even if it's not a place we want to be. Changing the way we think about our future is something we can control. Rather than thinking about what we don't have, let's appreciate everything we have. Rather than dwelling on what could have been, let's focus on what can be. That first step can be the most challenging. Let's have the courage to take that single step towards the person we aspire to be. The rest will follow!
