A Message from Our President

The Benefits of Aging

While the view that aging means the loss of many things is pervasive, there are actually benefits to getting older and many people feel more positive about their lives as they age.

People Are Happier

A survey of 2,000 adults by the Good News Network found that 75% of respondents agreed aging is not something to fight but an opportunity to live a more fulfilling and emotionally healthy life. In addition, 71% have seen areas of their lives improve with age such as confidence, better sense of self and relationships with family and friends. In fact, most people reported that they felt more fulfilled (69%) and satisfied (71%) with their lives today than they did in their 20s.

Stanford psychologist Laura Carstensen conducted a study that followed people ages 18 to 94 for a decade and found that they got happier as they aged. Negative emotions such as sadness, anger and fear decreased.

We Get Better!

Research has shown people do improve as they age. For example, emotional and social intelligence improve as we age, according to Dr. Davangere Deyanand, director of geriatric psychiatry at Columbia University. "Older people have less emotional volatility and a better understanding of relationships and have figured out strategies for different situations—what we call wisdom."

Scientists are also finding the mind can get sharper in a number of ways, contrary to the popular belief that all of our minds decline. In a University of Illinois study, older air traffic controllers excelled at their cognitively demanding jobs, despite some losses in short-term memory. They were expert at navigating, juggling multiple aircraft simultaneously and avoiding collisions. Experience matters!

People also learn to manage social conflicts more effectively as they age. Researchers at the University of Michigan found that when presented with problems, people in their 60s were better than younger participants at imagining different points of view, thinking of multiple resolutions and suggesting compromises.

Here at WCC, we are focused on leveraging our individual and collective strengths at every age. We reject the belief that everything 'goes downhill' as our chronological age advances. While there may be some things that work differently than before, we choose to celebrate and take full advantage of the things that are getting better.
